EAST MILLCREEK COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Thursday, June 2, 2005

The meeting was called to order by Judd Jones.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Tina Gillman.

Kurt Zimmerman -- financial report indicated a balance of \$662.84

Deputy Mike Cupello -- Community Policing Report -- not present.

Craig Beck - Association of Community Council Together (ACCT)

Special Legislative Session Bill 1010 was passed.

Holladay City received 3 million dollars in a grant from Salt Lake County.

Craig is working on a new traffic light for 2330 East 3300 South.

He is proposing making Millcreek Road by Skyline High a one-way street.

Granite School District has proposing to close Skyline High School in the near future.

Mill Creek Planning Commission presentation -- not present

Walt Gilmore -- Salt County Parks and Recreation made a presentation with the assistance of a map on the Wasatch Trail (Parley's Crossing to 6200 South). This project is funded to designate northbound and southbound "Bike Lanes" along Wasatch to Big Cottonwood Canyon. The cost of the project is \$500,000 and will begin in the spring of 2006. A Public Meeting is schedule for July 12, 2005 in the County South Building Atrium and please inform your friends.

New Water Assessment notices have been mailed out to Mill Creek property owners.

Gary Poulton who is the owner of two parcels located at 3643 South Highland Drive wanted to rezone from R-M and R-1-10 to C-1. A motion was made by Stewart Woodruff to recommend the change and the motion carried.

Carrie Goodwin of 3511 Millbrook Drive proposed installation of a street light due to several resent car burglaries in the neighborhood. She also wanted speed bumps installed on Millcreek Road to slow traffic due to many small children in the area. She was referred to County Planning and Zoning for these changes after gaining support from her neighbors. Further, she would like to know if the zone allow for multiple tenants in the house at the north end of Millbrook Drive.

Stewart Woodruff questioned the use of a private residence on Evergreen Avenue being a venue for a two day soccer tournament. The traffic and sanitation concerns may require a conditional use or event permit. This matter will be referred to the County Mayor's office.

Kurt Zimmerman indicated that County Flood Control employee visited with him and his neighbor today. This visit was six weeks after the initial complaint concerning the rocks in the culvert in Mill Creek under Millbrook Drive. Flood Control will attempt to clean out the debris in July 2005.
