The meeting was called to order by Richard Lee.

Report on the Evergreen Avenue sidewalk -- Dr. Lamb was concern about the through traffic during the project. This matter was referred to Stacy Adams of the Mayor's office. Kurt Zimmerman recommended signage "Local Traffic Only" is appropriate.

Kristen Garbbett -- discussed the possibility of creating a Historical District in East Millcreek. Homes that are 50 years old would qualify. Eligible home can receive a Utah State "tax credit." A committee was proposed to explore the Historical District possibility.
