

MINUTES
EAST MILLCREEK COMMUNITY COUNCIL
Thursday, October 5, 2006

Present: Kurt Zimmerman, Stewart Woodruff, Jay Griffith, Sally Kaiser, Nate Laver, Robin Bennion, and Judd Jones. Leslie Riddle and Rob Dunfield were excused.

The meeting was called to order by Jay Griffith.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Bob Gallagher, Vice Chair of the Lions Club.

Kurt Zimmerman – minutes from the September 7th meeting were approved with no amendments. Financial report indicates a balance of \$3,139.15. Sally Kaiser filling in this week.

Jay asked for volunteers to fill the secretary/treasure position since Kurt had resigned last month. No one volunteered so he suggested Leslie Riddle. She was unanimously elected to the position. Nate Laver suggested that it wasn't proper to elect a person to a position without that person being present. It was agreed that a vote be taken next month on the issue when Leslie would be present.

Richard Lee moved from neighborhood. Vacancy on the council approved. Kathy Swift was appointed to the council to replace him. She has ancestral ties to the neighborhood and was a hairdresser for 20 years. Excited to participate mostly with planning and zoning.

Deputy Mike Cupello made available the crime statistics for September. Property crimes were high again – related to graffiti vandalism. Letter from a woman on 2700 East 3300 South, concerned about people parking on road. Cars are parking legally. Mike also announced that the next Community Policing Class would not be on Thursday so that members from our council could attend.

A message from Mayor Corroon's office was delivered by Rebecca Sanchez.

- * Open door meeting with Mayor Corroon, October 19th 4-5:30, first come first serve. No November or December open door meeting.

- * Recycling Phase II. If recycle now, \$12 fee will be lowered to \$11. Call Mark Crockett if one has comments on this, they will be voting on this issue soon.

- *Mayor Corroon will be here in November.

- *Report on 3300 South coming soon from public works. She will e-mail Jay.

- *Minor subdivision will be posted on the county website in about 6-8 weeks. She will email with address.

- *Conditional use permits will be sent out to community councils again.

Apparently a new staff member at the county didn't know to send the info out.

Nathan and Tiffinie Marcotte applying for conditional use for a 1200 sq. ft. garage. Council has questions about height of garage and the Marcotte's were not at the meeting, so the discussion was tabled. Robin Bennion was asked to contact the Marcotte's and notify them of our next meeting.

David Perkins discussed building a 4000 sq ft office building. Conditional use permit was not available so this discussion was put off until the November meeting. Jay said he would contact Craig Hinckley regarding this.

Rod Vogel requested time next month to discuss traffic in the neighborhood at Skyline High School. He discussed that on the frontage road he has planted 31 trees and waters them on a regular basis out of 55 gallon drums.

Becky Lloyd had various questions about who EMCC is and how it operates, who the board members are and how they are elected.

Katherine Knight brought up concerns about traffic on Craig Drive.

A U of U student was in attendance for a class on doing a community assessment with an emphasis on environmental issues.

EMCC gave Judd Jones approval for writing a letter to Sinclair Corporation about rain washing suds into the Mill Creek.

Susan Lawrence requested that she be sent an agenda. She gave everyone and invitation to "meet the candidate" night and talked about HB-40 and paying for the feasibility study.

Judd Jones discussed the upcoming election of EMCC board members. Election is on November 7th. He handed out election applications to those on the council who are running for reelection. These must be returned by the 28th of October to Judd Jones. In addition he has requested help from all those who are on the election committee (basically all those who are not up for reelection) to help disseminate notices etc. of the election. Judd also reported that the county will only require that a ballot box be at the Evergreen library.

Nate Laver reported on the ACCT meeting. HB-40 and soccer stadium were discussed. He has compiled a list of churches in our boundaries.

Greg Offerman was asked and consented to attend the next ACCT meeting with Nate Laver. Nate announced his intention to attend all ACCT meetings.
